Four seats are on the ballot in the 2021 Delta Junction Municipal Election.

**Seats A (ending 2024), D (ending 2022), and E (ending 2024)
are open to write-ins**

**Incumbent Erin N. Catterson is running unopposed for Seat B, one year
remaining in its term and ending in October 2022**

Write-in candidates are eligible for city office if: a) they are a qualified voter within the city limits and b) a resident of the city for a period of not less than one year prior to the date of taking office.

A person is qualified to vote who: a) is a citizen of the United States; b) has passed their 18th birthday; c) has been a resident of the City of Delta Junction for at least 30 days preceding the election; d) has registered to vote 30 days before the election and is not registered in another jurisdiction; and e) is not disqualified under Article V of the State Constitution.

Application for absentee voting can be requested by mail or fax between April 5 and September 24, but ballots cannot be mailed to addresses within the City limits. Ballots must be postmarked by midnight October 5 and received no later than October 15, 2021.

A qualified voter can vote early in person between September 24 and October 4, 2021.

Voters with disabilities who are unable to go to the polling place may vote through a personal representative.

- ❑ To vote for the candidate of your choice, mark the circle to the left of the candidate's name for whom you wish to vote. The mark must be substantially inside the circle provided or touching the circle to indicate that you intend that particular area to be marked.
- ❑ To vote for a candidate who is not on the ballot, write in the person's name *and mark the circle to the left of the write-in space.*
- ❑ Do not vote for more than one candidate for each seat.
- ❑ Any erasure or correction will invalidate only that part of the ballot in which it appears. If you spoil or mar your ballot, return it to the election official and receive another ballot. Your spoiled ballot will be destroyed in your presence.
